Prof. Dr. Juliane Vogel studied English and German at the Universities of Vienna (Austria) and Freiburg (Germany). She wrote her Ph.D.-Thesis about antiquity in science and literature in Vienna around 1900 and her habilitation treatise about the dramaturgy of the "great scene" within the tragedy of the 19th century, also a book about Empress Elisabeth of Austria. She was Associate Professor of German Literature at the University of Vienna, visiting Professor at the University of Munich and research Fellow at the University of California at Berkeley. Nowadays she is Professor for German Literature and General Literature Studies at the University of Konstanz and Permanent Visiting Professor at Princeton University. Prof. Vogel is elected member of the Scientific Board of Deutsches Literaturarchiv Marbach, of the International Research Center for Cultural Studies in Vienna and appointed member of the plenum board of the Center of Excellence Cultural Foundations of Integration at the University of Konstanz. Beneath her wide range of publications considering drama, tragedy and opera her further research interests are literature of the fin de siècle, contemporary Austrian literature and aesthetic of interruption, e.g. techniques of cut-up and montage.

"They have their exits and their entrances" What it means to make an appearance in drama and theater.

Taking a general as well as a historical approach, the lecture discusses premises and forms of the act of "making an appearance". From the point of view of dramatic and theatrical forms, it will ask what it means "to have an entrance" on a given stage and will investigate the strategies which guarantee the visibility of persons appearing onstage. From a sociological point of view, it will also discuss what it means to step forward into a public space and analyse the quest for recognition and acknowledgement which is fundamental for what may be called the performative art of entering. Furthermore, the lecture will try to identify strategies of gaining evidence in the eyes of an audience, but will also deal with moments of failure and crisis that occur in the procedure.
